Central Coast Heart players competed at the elite level including Lauren Moore in Suncorp Super Netball (as a member of GIANTS Netball); Dakota Thomas and Zoe Peden as part of the Swifts Academy; Hope White won a gold medal as part of the NSW 17U team; Charlee Belcher and Maraea Paea were part of the NSW 17U train-on squad and, along with Aela Streatfield were part of the Regional Emerging Talent Team.

Central Coast Heart coaches were also recognised at the elite level with Amber Cross coaching the NSW 17U team to a gold medal at the National Netball Championships (and was recently announced as the 2023 coach); Under 23s Coach, Kirstie Fuller, was named Head Coach of the Northern Inland team and Under 23s Assistant Coach, Jade Nicoll, was named Assistant Coach of the Hunter team in the Regional State Cup; and Metro League Coach, Gima Crowdy, achieved her elite accreditation and was appointed head coach of the Papua New Guinea national team.
